Idaho Gem Club April Field Trip

Hooker Creek & Mahogany Dendrites: petrified wood & jasper

When: April 24th; meet between 8 a.m. and 8:30 a.m.
We will leave promptly at 8:30 a.m.

Where to meet: Kmart parking lot on Karcher Rd (Highway 55). We will caravan from Kmart or you can meet us at ION Truck Stop or Hooker Creek if you know the way.

How to get there: travel West on I-84 to Exit 33A, the new Nampa Highway 55 exit. Travel West on Highway 55 through Marsing to the Intersection of Hwy 55 and Hwy 95. We will stop at the ION Truck Stop to meet other rock hounds, we will leave here at 9:10 a.m. Go south onto Highway 95, travel into Oregon to the sign that says Jordan Craters (about milepost 12). There is a dirt road on the east side across from the Jordan Craters sign. This is the entrance to Hooker Creek. After lunch we will go west on Jordan Craters road until we reach the collection area, approximately twenty five miles. Drive time is about one half hour from the Ion Truck Stop to Hooker Creek and one hour to the Mahogany Dendrites from Hooker Creek. A high clearance vehicle with good tires is required for the last half mile at the Mahogany Dendrite dig, this last half mile can and will tear up soft side tires. There is parking before this last descent, you can ride with someone that has room or take the short hike into the collection area.

Equipment needed: rock hammer, chisel, shovel, safety glasses, appropriate clothing for the weather and location, food for the time you will be there, water, full tank of gas, and any items you need for your personal use. I will use no firearms or blasting material in collecting areas.

I will cause no willful damage to property of any kind such as fences, signs, buildings, etc.

I will leave all gates as found.

I will build fires only in designated or safe places and will be certain they are completely extinguished before leaving the area.

I will discard no burning material - matches, cigarettes, etc.

I will fill all excavation holes which may be dangerous to livestock.

I will not contaminate wells, creeks, or other water supplies.

I will cause no willful damage to collecting material and will take home only what I can reasonably use.

I will practice conservation and undertake to utilize fully and well the materials I have collected and will recycle my surplus for the pleasure and benefit of others.

I will support the rockhound project H.E.L.P (Help Eliminate Litter Please) and will leave all collecting areas devoid of litter, regardless of how found.

I will cooperate with field trip leaders and those in designated authority in all collecting areas.

I will report to my club or federation officer, Bureau of Land Management or other authorities, any deposit of petrified wood or other materials on public lands which should be protected for the enjoyment of future generations for public educational and scientific purposes.

I will appreciate and protect our heritage of natural resources.

I will observe the "Golden Rule", I will use Good Outdoor Manners and will at all times conduct myself in a manner which will add to the stature and Public Image of Rockhounds everywhere.

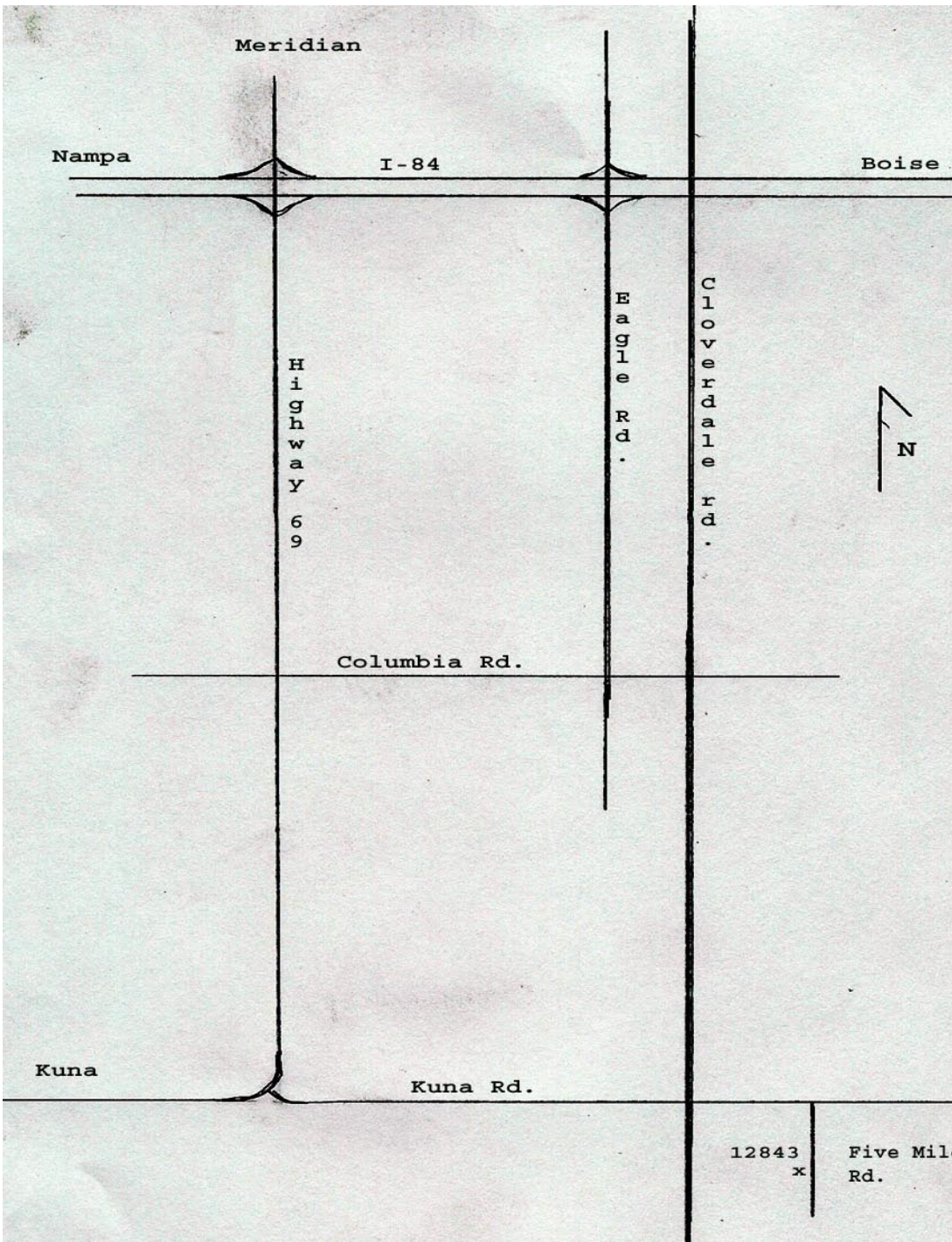


Workshop Report

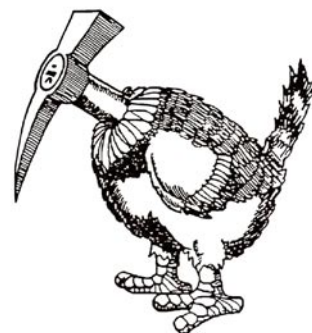
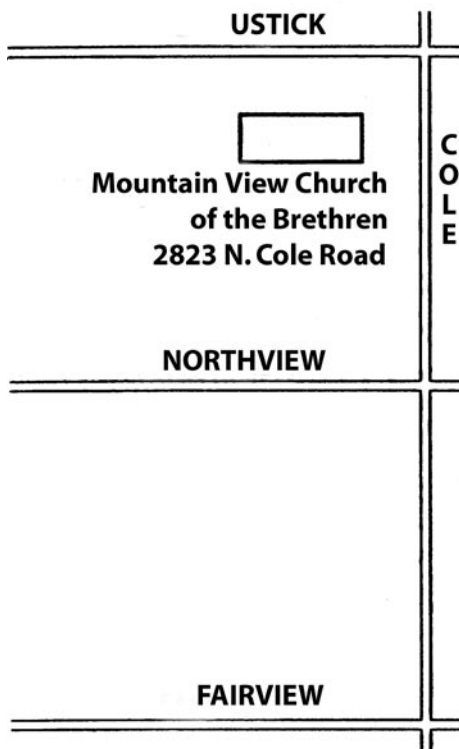
