The combination of size and material is at the discretion of the participant. The cabochons will be judged on choice of material, sanding and grinding, polish, and symmetry.

July Field Trip Report Graveyard Point

Our field trip was definitely on the warm side. Even at 7:30 a.m. the warm morning air was a portent of what to expect today, breezes throughout the day made the heat more bearable. Graveyard Point is relatively close to Boise allowing for shortened travel time. There were thirty one of us on this trip; twenty three adult members, three adult guests, and five Rocky Rattlers of which three were guests.

Our first stop, just over the border into Oregon, produced an abundance of darker plume agate and jasper. One rather large rattlesnake made its presence known quite noticeably. Most of us didn't see the snake, but it had rather noisy rattles. Just before we left for our second stop one of the rock hounds was able to get the snake to move out into the open for our inspection. Goody!

The second stop was our claim arriving there about 11:00 a.m. A few new digging sites near where we parked had been found prior to our arrival today. These looked like good places to start looking and indeed produced an abundance of quality plume agate. Hopefully, everyone found something of worth to take home.

At about 2:15 p.m. a majority of rock hounds were hot, tired, and ready to go home. Some die hard rock hounds decided to checkout locations for green and red plume agate along the road going north in the valley towards Sagenite (Million Dollar) Hill.

Idaho Gem Club August Field Trip

Silver City, Idaho

When: Saturday, August 21st, 2010; meet between 7:30 a.m. and 8:00 a.m.; leave promptly at 8:00 a.m.

Where: Vern and Kim Tunnel have graciously invited us to collect crystals and other mineral specimens in and for a tour around Silver City for our August field trip.

Plan for the day: There is no gas in Silver City. After we collect crystals we will eat lunch in the Masons Hall. You can bring your own or purchase lunch at the hotel restaurant to go and bring it there. We will visit some of the buildings that are open to the public to get a feel of what life may have been for these early Idahoans.

How to get there: Take the Meridian Rd. exit off I-84; travel south to Kuna where we will meet at Paul's Market on the north side of E. Avalon behind the Arctic Circle. Meridian Rd. intersects E. Kuna; this is just past the curve as the road turns west going into Kuna; Kuna Rd becomes E. Avalon just after the curve. From here we will travel to Walter's Ferry off Highway 45 south of Nampa. From Walter's Ferry we will travel on Highway 78 through Murphy to the intersection that will take us to Silver City.

Depending on how many vehicles in our caravan we will stop at Ruby City rest stop if many cars; if only a few cars we will go into Silver City and park at the camp ground. Vern will meet us at one of these two stops and take us for a tour of Silver City then for places to collect crystals. Time permitting we may travel to Wagontown for opalized wood and bog wood. **Equipment needed:** rock hammer, chisel, shovel, pick, safety glasses, appropriate clothing for the weather and location, water, fuel, and any items you need for your personal use. If you plan on camping, please bring your own camping gear, food for the weekend, also the campgrounds are primitive although there are outhouses. It is tick season, so bring tick spray or wipes! Rattlesnakes are abundant this year; be aware and careful of snakes and areas that have snakes. I will discard no burning material - matches, cigarettes, etc.

I will fill all excavation holes which may be dangerous to livestock.

I will not contaminate wells, creeks,or other water supplies.

 ${\rm I}$ will cause no willful damage to collecting material and will take home only what ${\rm I}$ can reasonably use.

I will practice conservation and undertake to utilize fully and well the materials I have collected and will recycle my surplus for the pleasure and benefit of others .

I will support the rockhound project H.E.L.P (Help Eliminate Litter Please) and will leave all collecting areas devoid of litter, regardless of how found.

I will cooperate with field trip leaders and those in designated authority in all collecting areas.

I will report to my club or federation officer, Bureau of Land Management or other authorities, any deposit of petrified wood or other materials on public lands which should be protected for the enjoyment of future generations for public educational and scientific purposes.
