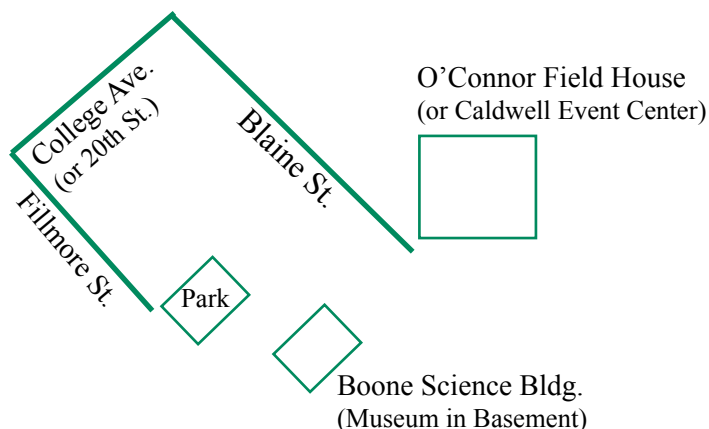

IDAHO MINERAL & GEMSTONE LOCATIONS (continued from February issue)

For those members who would like to venture further than our regular field trips take you, here are some locations around Idaho that are popular with rockhounds.

Ovid-Liberty

In the southeast corner of the state is an area where you can dig your own trilobite fossils. The site is near Liberty, ID, and has a fairly good road for most of the journey. The last mile is fairly rough so you will need an appropriate vehicle. As with most Idaho backroads, it can be a challenge when wet.

The fossils are in a shale outcrop of Cambrian age. At this site blocks are split in thin layers to reveal the fossils, much as you would for leaf fossils. Some trilobites are not complete but you should be able to find some good specimens.

Take Hwy. 36 from Preston to Liberty. From Liberty, head south on Lanark Rd. for 1.2 miles, then turn onto Mill Farm Rd. (NF Road 405). After 4.2 miles turn right on NF 939 and the site is about a mile in.

China Hat

Another location in that general area is China Hat. The small volcanic cone is composed of a glassy, frothy, light grey rhyolitic rock that will fluoresce light cream to orange under ultra-violet light. While it isn't a grand gem material, it would be an interesting specimen to add to your fluorescent mineral collection. The colors are brightest under long-wave ultra-violet light, but will also show under short-wave.

From Soda Springs, travel north on Hwy. 34 to China Cap Rd. Turn left and proceed to the area just past the Dike Rd. turn-off to Blackfoot Reservoir. The collecting areas are in the ditches under the road cuts to the south of the road. The nearby quarry is on private land and inaccessible. There is also a campground by Blackfoot Reservoir to the north.

Daugherty Gulch

To the west of Challis is an area where fluorite can be found. In one pit the fluorite is exposed and so it is lighter in color. To find good pieces of crystallized fluorite you will need to do some digging. There are some pits with fluorite crystals in the cavities of brecciated dolomite. The rock is very hard so you will need a heavy hammer and chisels here.

From Challis travel west along Main St., which turns into Garden Creek Rd., for 5.3 miles. After the Living Waters Ranch Conference Center, turn right onto the Custer Motorway and look for the pits. The Ranch has claims in the area so it would be prudent to stop on the way by for any information they can provide. They also have cabins available to rent for your stay.

Ruby Rapids

Near Riggins in the Salmon River Canyon is an area with garnet crystals. They are not the star garnets like Emerald Creek, but some are clear, gem quality crystals.

The location is 7 miles east of Hwy. 95 in a narrow canyon. Turn off Hwy. 95 at Big Salmon Rd. just at the edge of Riggins. Follow the Salmon River for 7 miles to the collecting area. There is a campground above the collecting area as well. Garnets are found below the road in the gravel between large boulders at the rapids. There are camping areas along the river through the canyon. It is best to go in the last summer or early fall when water levels are low.

Burgdorf

There are two good sites in Idaho to find corundum/sapphire. One is at Threemile Creek north of Burgdorf, and the other is Ruby Meadows to the south of Burgdorf. The sites are areas that were placer mined for gold. The sapphires are in the fine sand and small rocks around larger boulders. The material varies in color from dark browns to lavender and pink. It is good for cabochons, but is not facet quality. Occasionally you may find an asterism (star) in a cut cabochon. You can still find surface specimens by walking through the gravel deposits, but you'll find a better selection by screening the gravels.

From Hwy. 95 in McCall, turn right onto Warren Wagon Rd. The Ruby Meadows site is first. The turn is to the right onto NF Road 364. For the second site, turn off Warren Wagon Rd. onto Burgdorf Rd. (NF Road 246). The site is beyond Burgdorf at Threemile Creek, off to the left of the road.

Crystal Mountain is also in this area, behind a campground. There are many quartz pieces in the roadway to collect, however the last time I was there you could not go to the top. Apparently someone has made a claim for mining the material.

Mine Tours

Two mines in northern Idaho offer mine tours. The Sierra Silver Mine in Wallace and the Crystal Gold Mine near Kellogg. Both locations have instructional tours into the mines where you will see demonstrations of mining equipment, as well as equipment in actual use. You will also learn a lot about the history of the North Idaho Mining District. Both locations are easily accessible from Hwy. 90. While in the area you can also visit the Sunshine Miners Memorial.

Other

Hagerman is another interesting location to visit closer to home. In the town of Hagerman is a museum and information center at 221 State St. From there take Hwy. 30 toward Buhl. After crossing the river, turn right on ?? Road, and go 2.6 miles to the viewpoint where you can see the low hills beside the river containing fossil-bearing sediments. On the other side of the road is a sign for the Old Oregon Trail. A trail leads down from the viewpoint into the gulch where you can hike a section of the original pioneer route. Another overlook about three miles up the road has more information on the trail.

Also in the area is the Hagerman Wildlife Management Area. After crossing the river from Hagerman, turn into the Rest Area on the left side of the road. In the winter and early spring there are mallard ducks as far as you can see up the creek. In the pond across the road from the rest area you can often see young swans spending the winter together.

To get GPS coordinates and referrals to topo maps for these sites, see Gem Trails of Idaho and Western Montana by Lanny Ream, available at rock shops and the Idaho Museum of Mining and Geology.

2. Opal (Spencer, Camas Creek, Little Squaw Creek, near Lewiston)
3. Gypsum (Bannock Co., Washington Co., Hwy. 95 roadcuts southwest of Midvale)
4. Petrified Wood (larger specimens found at Malm Gulch, Spar Canyon, both near Challis)
5. Agate/Jasper/Chalcedony (Graveyard Point, Owyhee County, Succor Creek)
6. Aquamarine (found in Sawtooth Wilderness -- no collection allowed)
7. Feldspar (Shafer Creek, Crystal Butte, Lemhi County)
8. Garnet (Emerald Creek, Canyon Creek, Salmon River)

Liz went over the progression for the ROLE program. The first two stones at the Novice level are made at the regular workshops before moving on to the ROLE workshops.

Secretary Report: No report.

Program Report: Paul Verhage will be doing a talk on Meteorites that will include the juniors. The juniors will have their meeting afterward.

Field Trip Report: Rick went over the tentative schedule for this years' field trips. March 25th will be to the museum at the College of Idaho Boone Science Building. Meeting at the O'Connor Field House parking lot at 9 am. Don Dixon will open up for us. June 17-18 the Spectrum Mine is having a get together. It would be a good time to go for sunstones. Cheryl will lead. Details to come.

The Juniors will be visiting collection sites this summer and will have a schedule soon. We need to get the kids out building collections.

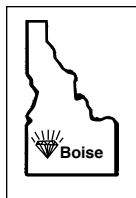

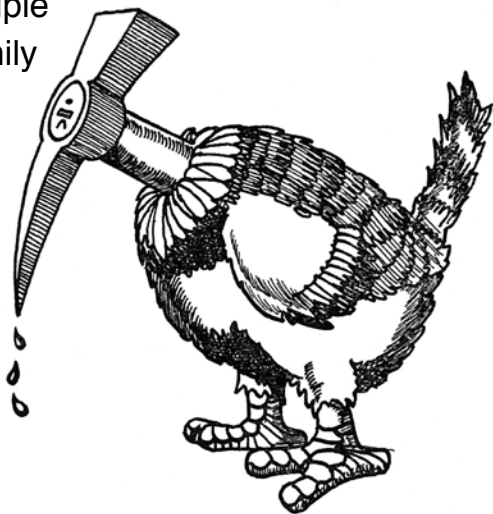
