PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello Fellow Rockhounds:

Spring is almost here and there are exciting times ahead this year in our club. We just had our Gem Show a couple of weeks ago, and it was a grand affair. We got many new members and lots of excitement for things to come. Thank you members for all the hard work setting up and a record time tearing down and loading the trailers. Thanks also to all of our vendors, who make it possible for us to host the biggest and best gem show in Idaho.

This month's field trip will be to the Idaho Museum of Mining and Geology, located at 2455 Old Penitentiary Rd. next to the Old Penitentiary entrance. The museum opens at 12 noon so we'll meet there at noon on March 23rd. Coyote Short is working there and will answer any questions you have about rocks or minerals. She is one of our geologists and is full of information. We are doing an indoor field trip in March because the weather in Idaho is unpredictable and we don't want to tear up roads and damage fragile areas during the wet season.

In April we'll be going to our claim at Graveyard Point for the world famous Plume Agates. Sometimes lace agates can also be found. It is always a great time with lots of material to be found. The date of that field trip is April 20th. We'll meet at 8 am at the Chevron Truck Stop just outside of Marsing on the corner of Hwys. 55 and 95. We'll be leaving at 8:30, so don't be late. A high clearance vehicle is nice, but four wheel drive is usually not necessary, weather depending. If the weather is not cooperating we will go to Plan B and head for Sommer Camp Rd. and the Queenstone claim.

Also in March we are having a Show Pizza Party to thank all who helped work, set-up and tear down the show. This will be on Wednesday, March 27 at 6 pm. We'll be dining at Idaho Pizza Co., located at 7444 W. Fairview Ave. in Boise, west of Fairview and Cole, so bring your appetite and call everyone who helped with the show. 

Patsy Rae (Phipps) Bethel

Sept. 4, 1925-Mar. 1, 2024

Patsy Rae (Phipps) Bethel, our eldest female club member at age 96, died Friday, March 1, 2024, at her home. Patsy was a lifetime member of the Idaho Gem Club and served as President in 1971. She was married to Roy Bethel, for 76 years. Roy passed away October 4, 2023.

She had creativity and artistry which enhanced her skills as a

lapidarist, silversmith and goldsmith. She was an intelligent, resourceful woman who contributed to our club in many ways. Patsy and Roy loved looking at gems and minerals all of their lives. They created a way to identify petrified wood using a microscope and recording cell structure. They shared their knowledge with others and continued to collect all woods from Lake Bonneville, which covered our region. They hosted evenings of crafts and lapidary at their home with other couples, and camped out at most collecting locations. They traveled to the coast in groups of 10 or more, forming the lasting friendships that kept our club fun and family oriented, growing together.

The couple made jewelry boxes of slabs, framed cabochons within rings made of stone, faceted gemstones, and created settings from lost wax casting and solid design drawn by Patsy. Patsy also created critters from snakeskin agates which filled the wheel of fortune tables at our show. Roy tumbled thousands of rocks for grab bags and they graded ROLE students' stones in the program. In 2015 they donated a massive collection of rocks to the club.

Quincy and Tej Howell, Mildred and John Beckwith, and the Stewarts were part of their generation, and each left a legacy in the world of rockhounds. The pioneers who discovered most of the stones we love to work with today.

The Bethels were the eldest couple in the club. When we lose these masters, our loss is great. To have learned from them is a fortunate experience.

A memorial service will be held Saturday, April 6, 2024, at 2:00 pm at Boise Valley Church of the Brethren, 4721 N. Star Road, Meridian. Afterwards, Patsy will be laid to rest next to

her husband at the Idaho State Veterans Cemetery.


Sixteen new member applications were reviewed. Willa made a motion to accept all the new applications, Deana seconded, the board voted and the motion carried.
