

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello Rockhounds, Rock Geeks and Artisans

We have a lot to cover today. First we're having a Trunk/Rock Sale before our meeting on Tuesday, May 21, from 5-6:45 pm. Bring your slabs and cabs, rough and jewelry, tools or ??. We like it all. Bring your stuff and sell or trade it in the parking lot of the Maple Grove Grange. Then at our meeting at 7 pm we'll have a few minutes of "Show and Tell" to discuss what we found.

There will be a workshop on Thursday evening, May 23, from 6-8:45 pm in the shop behind Stewart's Gem Shop. Then on Saturday, May 25, we have a field trip to Tony Funk's Rock Yard in Gooding. Directions are in the *Grindings* on page 4. If you want to follow a caravan, the Owyhee club is meeting at the rest stop just before Black's Creek exit on I-84. We'll meet there at 8 am, leaving at 8:30 am. Or drive to Tony's and arrive around 10 am. Don't forget to bring your favorite dish for our pot luck lunch. Tony will be cooking hamburgers and hot dogs with the fixings, but we are bringing the sides. Also bring any drinks you want, your table service, and buckets for rocks. Tony has several acres of rocks that are very well priced to sell!

On June 1st and 2nd we'll be heading to Beacon Hill for the unique moss agates. We'll meet at 8 am at the Rest Stop outside of Ontario, OR. A high clearance vehicle is a must, but 4-wheel drive is not needed. Come prepared to dig with a rock hammer, chisels, buckets, lunch and plenty of water. This claim is visited only twice a year and you must come with the club for entry. Since we cross private lands we must have permission and keys to the gate. We will be leaving the rest stop at 8:30 am, so don't be late.

The next weekend, June 7-9, is the Gem Faire at Expo Idaho. We are guests there and they allow us to demonstrate and promote our club, hand out applications, etc. We can display things, but not sell as that's unfair to the paid vendors. We'll have a cab machine there for grinding cabs, and we'll be answering questions, too, so sign up for shifts to help out at the table. Set-up is Thursday, June 6th at 10 am-6 pm. The show is Friday the 7th from Noon-6 pm, Saturday the 8th from 10 am-6 pm, and Sunday the 9th from 10 am-5 pm. There will be a sign-up sheet on the front table at the next meeting. It's a great show for tools and an assortment of rocks and jewelry.

Also in June, our next field trip on the 22nd will be to Silver City for quartz crystal clusters. We are meeting at Dan's 66 Station at Walters Ferry at 8 am, leaving at 8:30 am. We'll be going directly to Silver City for a short tour, then off to look for crystals.

July is Thunder Egg Days in Nyssa on July 11, 12 and 13. We'll have a booth for you to bring your treasures to sell; cabs, slabs, rough rock or jewelry. We'll have a cab machine available for demonstrating cabbing, as well. We'll need members to man the booth all three days. It's also important to show up for set-up on Wednesday the 10th after 10 am. Sign-up sheets will be on the front table at the May and June meetings. Please come and support our club and help with set-up, manning the booth, and tear down on Saturday evening. Many hands make easier work. It's always a good time with lot's of wonderful people and a great place to find the rocks you've been looking for.

It's a busy time of year, but I'm never too busy to look for rocks. Come be a part of the best gem club in Idaho!



FIELD TRIP

The field trip for May will be to Tony Funk's Rock Yard in Gooding. He has several acres of rocks sorted in piles with various prices. We will be meeting at Tony's place in Gooding at 10 am. According to Google it will take about 1-3/4 hours to get there so you can plan your departure. If you would rather caravan, the Caldwell club is meeting at the Rest Stop just east of Boise on I-84 at 8 am, leaving at 8:30 am. John Wright will be leading the group.
