

William "Bill" Stringer May 12, 1924 - November 6, 2024

William "Bill" Stringer passed away peacefully of natural causes on November 6, 2024.

Bill was born on May 12, 1924, near Parsons, KS, to Elbert Harvey and Emma Alice Stringer. He attended schools near Parsons and worked on farms in the area while growing up. As a youth and in the Navy, he was known

Bill worked on the construction crew for the Kansas Ordinance Plant and also worked on the production lines there. He completed welding classes which led to a job at the Wichita Aircraft Machine Shop.

In 1943, he enlisted with the United States Navy and attended boot camp at Farragut, Idaho. He trained in diesel motor maintenance in California, and was assigned to Amphibious Landing Craft in Coronado, CA. He completed commando training at Camp Pendleton, and helped train Army 86-92nd in amphibious landings at Morrow Bay. He was then assigned to the AK47 Ship, the 3rd ship to land in Sasebo Harbor, Japan, after the atomic bomb that ended World War II. He was honorably discharged in April 1946 as a 2nd Motor Machinist MMC, and returned home to Kansas.

He met the love of his life, Anna Mae Lewis in Erie, KS. Bill and Anna were married on December 17, 1948, in Bentonville, AR, and were married almost 64 years.

They tried their luck at farming, but it was very hard in Kansas, so Bill worked for the MKT Railroad until they closed operations in Parsons. He and Anna moved their family to Nampa in 1957 where he worked for the Union Pacific Railroad at the Boise Depot and then as a Yard Office Clerk at the Nampa Depot. He retired in 1985. Bill and Anna enjoyed living in Nampa and raised five children there.

Bill and Anna operated Stringer's Gem Shop in Nampa from 1978, and Bill finally closed the shop in 2024. Bill enjoyed helping new rockhounds get started and teaching people how to use lapidary equipment and metal detectors. He skillfully worked rock specimens into works of art. His favorite rocks to work were Idaho Fire Opal and Owyhee Picture Jasper. He was a member of the Owyhee Gem & Mineral Society.

Bill loved to take care of his garden, fruit trees, and lawn. He had quite the green thumb. Bill also loved to hunt and fish in Kansas and Idaho. Bill and Anna enjoyed fishing, rock hunting, dancing at The Elks, traveling in their R.V., and spent several winters in Arizona. They traveled through Europe and enjoyed taking cruises.

Bill was an amazing father and loved taking care of his family. Bill and Anna have five children, 13 grandchildren, 17 great-grandchildren, and several great-grandchildren.



Clinton A. Chaney February 23, 1940 - September 9, 2024

Clinton Albert Chaney was born on February 23, 1940, to Wilbur and Alice Chaney. He was a self-described wanderer and loved being able to hike and explore nature around the Boise River when he was growing up. He attended Boise High

until his senior year when Borah High School was opening and was in the first graduating class of 1958. After high school he attended Boise Junior College for a time.

In 1966 Clint married Doris McCoy in Nampa. They had three children. Because Clint enjoyed the outdoors, he and Doris often took their children camping at Murdock Creek near Sun Valley when the kids were young. Clint and Doris shared 45 years of marriage.

Clint had an extremely hard work ethic. Over the years he worked for the Boise Cascade print shop, Boise Vault, and Hansen Painting for many years painting mostly bridges, and eventually homes. He retired while working for Prestige Homes.

One of Clint's passions was photography and he operated Chaney Photography for several years specializing in outdoor landscapes and wedding photography. Many of his pictures were featured in a publication called *Incredible Idaho* back in the 1970's. In later years he loved to go hiking and taking photos in the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest in Oregon.

After retirement in 2005, Clint discovered another passion for rocks. He enjoyed hunting for them and then bringing them home to cut, polish, and turn into pieces of jewelry to give away. He especially liked making crosses that could be worn as necklaces. He joined the Idaho Gem Club in 2011.

Clint passed peacefully of natural causes to be with the Lord on September 9, 2024, at Swan Falls Assisted Living.
